China and America: Sleeping Walk into Conflict?

As tensions between the United States and China keep rising and there is no light at the end of the tunnel, their relationship has come to its lowest point since the normalization of the diplomatic relationship in 1979. Leaders in both Washington and Beijing claim to want to avoid a new Cold War, but they are already engaged in a global struggle for dominance. As the two most powerful countries in the international system, each is the other's greatest potential threat and goes to considerable lengths to reduce the other's ability to threaten their security, prosperity, or way of life. What are the unique features of the current Sino-US conflict? How have they got to the point? What are the root causes of this rivalry? What is the prospect of the Sino-US competition? My presentation will seek answers to these important questions.

Suisheng Zhao is a Professor and Director of the Center for China-US Cooperation at Josef Korbel School of International Studies, University of Denver. He is the founder and editor of the *Journal of Contemporary China* and the author and editor of more than two dozen of books. His most recent book is *The Dragon Roars Back: Transformational Leaders and Dynamics of Chinese Foreign Policy* (Stanford University Press, 2022). A Post-Doctoral Campbell National Fellow at Hoover Institution of Stanford University, he received his Ph.D. degree in political science from the University of California-San Diego, an M.A. degree in Sociology from the University of Missouri, and BA and M.A. degrees in economics from Peking University.
